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Founded in 1970, Houston Academy (HA) is southeast Alabama's premier college preparatory school. HA is the only independent school in the region that focuses on college preparation and global education. HA attracts students from "the Wiregrass," which is the moniker for an approximately 250,000-person region that encompasses north Florida, southwest Georgia, and southeast Alabama. Students who come to Houston Academy seek a well-rounded educational experience that includes a strong emphasis on challenging academics, community involvement, athletics, and the arts.

THE MIDDLE SCHOOL FACULTY

Houston Academy's middle school has 27 faculty members. 100% of teachers have Bachelor's degrees. 60% percent of HA's faculty hold advanced degrees and have taught for an average of 19 years. 2 faculty members hold a PhD. The student-teacher ratio is 10:1.

HISTORY AND COMMUNITY

Houston Academy is a co-educational day school for preschool through twelfth grade. The school was founded in 1970 to fill the community need for a college preparatory school to serve the Dothan area and surrounding towns. The nineteen acre campus is located in one of Dothan's residential areas.

Located in the southeast corner of Alabama, Dothan is a progressive community of approximately 67,000. It offers cultural and recreational activities as well as a community college and a four year university.

TECHNOLOGY

Houston Academy is committed to providing the best technology resources and solutions in support of the school's mission and the Strategic Plan. At the beginning of the 2012-13 school year, an initiative began that provided students in grades 5-8 MacBook laptops for use 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Faculty utilize Smart boards, document cameras, Smart Response Systems, LCD projectors, curriculum based software, digital microscopes, and subscription based educational programs to enhance students' knowledge. School-wide wireless network covers the campus, providing network and internet access to all classrooms and learning areas. State-of-the-art technology tools integrated into the curriculum offer Houston Academy students a comprehensive 21st century education.

ADMISSION PROCESS

Houston Academy enrolls qualified students without regard to race, color, national or ethnic origin, or physical handicap. The school encourages prospective parents to schedule a campus tour with the Director of Admissions before initiating the application process.

Students seeking admission must submit a completed application form online along with the \$75 non-refundable application fee. Applicants should submit the Academic Reference Forms, provided in the Houston Academy packet or on the website, to their current classroom teacher for completion. These reference forms and an official transcript should then be forwarded from the previous school to the Director of Admissions at Houston Academy.

New student testing to measure ability levels is required of all applicants for grades 5-8. After the application is received, applicants will be notified as to the date and time for the testing.

The Admissions Committee will review and evaluate the application materials and tests of all applicants. Those who meet the criteria for admission will be offered a contract provided openings are available. Priority will be given to qualified siblings and children of alumni. In situations where there are no openings, qualified applicants' names will be placed in a waiting pool to be considered for the next opening. Admission will be offered to applicants in the waiting pool as openings become available.

DAILY SCHEDULE

Students in grade 5-8 meet daily between 8:00 a.m. and 3:15 p.m.

TUITION

Tuition for grades 5-8 is \$13,718. Payment options are available. Financial assistance through Facts Tuition Management is available to all students on the basis of demonstrated need. Application for admission may be found on our website.

STUDENT CLUBS & ACTIVITIES

Houston Academy sponsors a variety of clubs and activities, including some options that are initiated by students, to pursue a particular interest. The program focuses upon the social, emotional, physical, intellectual, psychological, and ethical development of students.

ATHLETICS

Students in grades 7 and 8 are also eligible to participate in athletics. Houston Academy adheres to the student-athlete requirements as established by the Alabama High School Athletic Association
